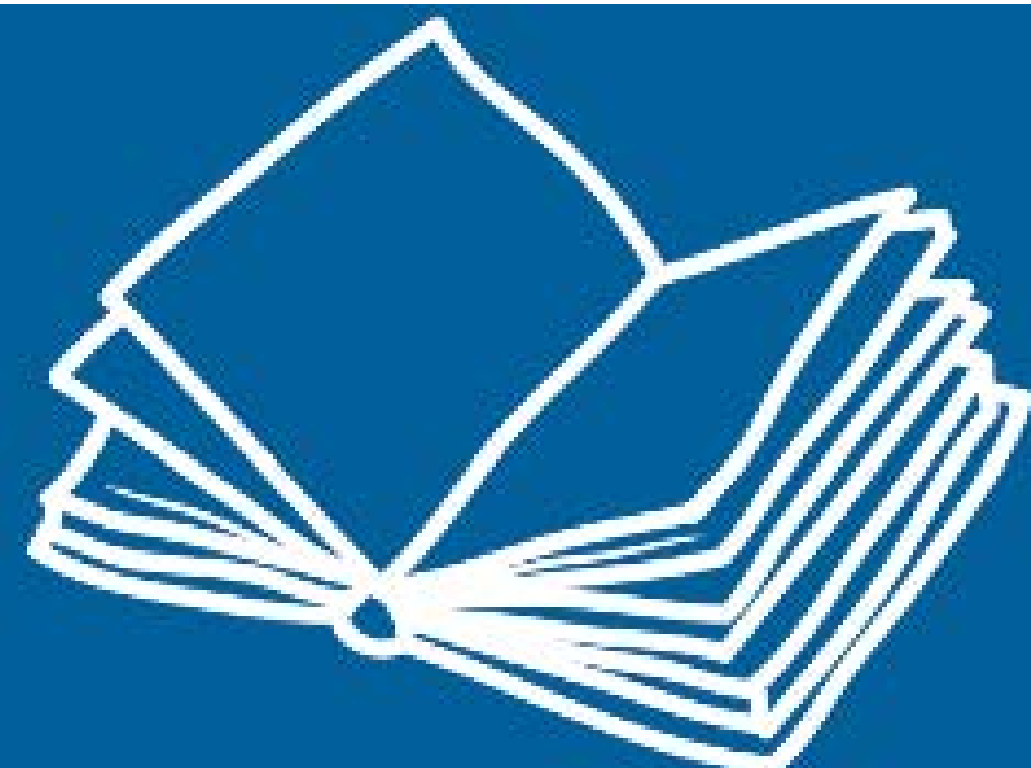

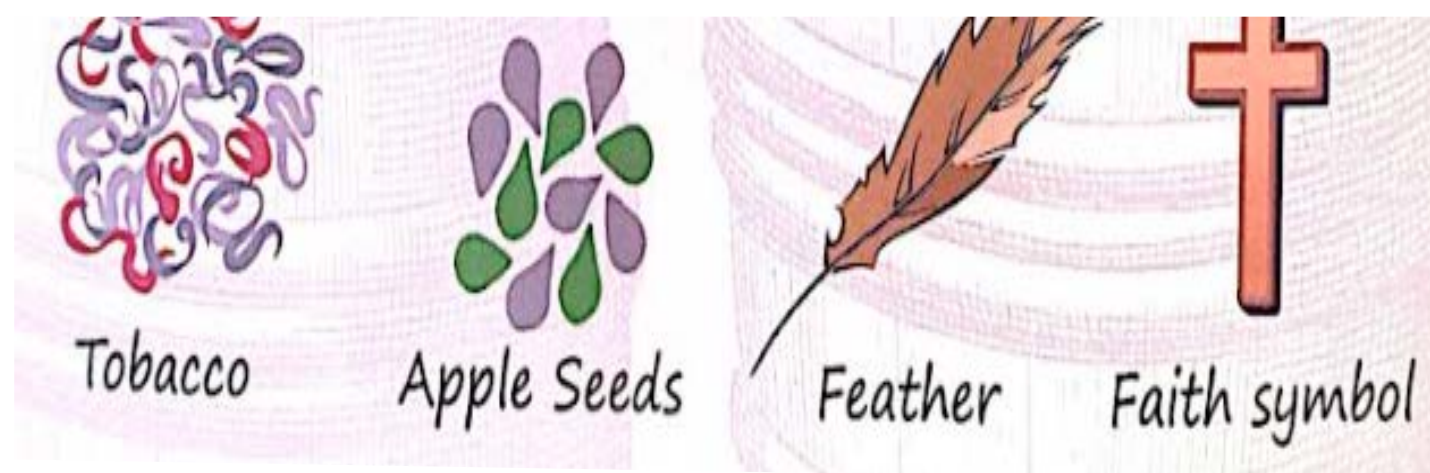
Instructions:

FAST FACTS

WHEN? WHAT?

York Minster is the official seat of the Archbishop of York. This title was once held by Thomas Wolsey.

Thomas Wolsey was the Lord Chancellor of England and had a vast fortune almost as large as King Henry VIII.

He lost his fortune after being charged with treason for failing to convince the Pope to grant a divorce for Henry and Catherine of Aragon.

Despite holding the title Archbishop of York Wolsey never visited York.

FAST FACTS

WHEN? WHAT?

York has quaint cobbled streets and historic timber-framed buildings that form York's iconic Shambles. (You will see this during the walk)

The cramped layout served a very practical purpose. That area was the site of a butchers' market and it provided shade to keep the meat fresh.

You will see overhanging upper floors which meant that tenants would pay less tax as the tax was established from the measurements of the ground

Directions:

With the Minster to your right walk down the path and turn right onto Minster Yard.

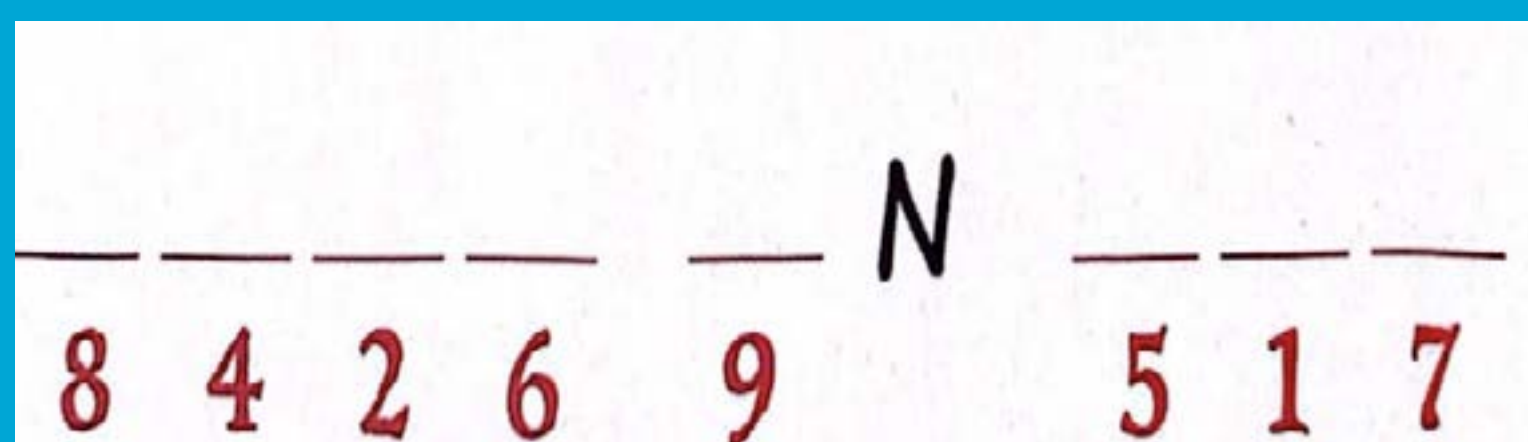
The clue is in this part of the street before you reach Chapter House St on the left.

Directions:

From the Minster Yard, turn left onto Chapter House St.

Follow Chapter House St until it turns right onto Ogleforth St.

Follow the street until you reach the first turning to the left onto Goodramgate.

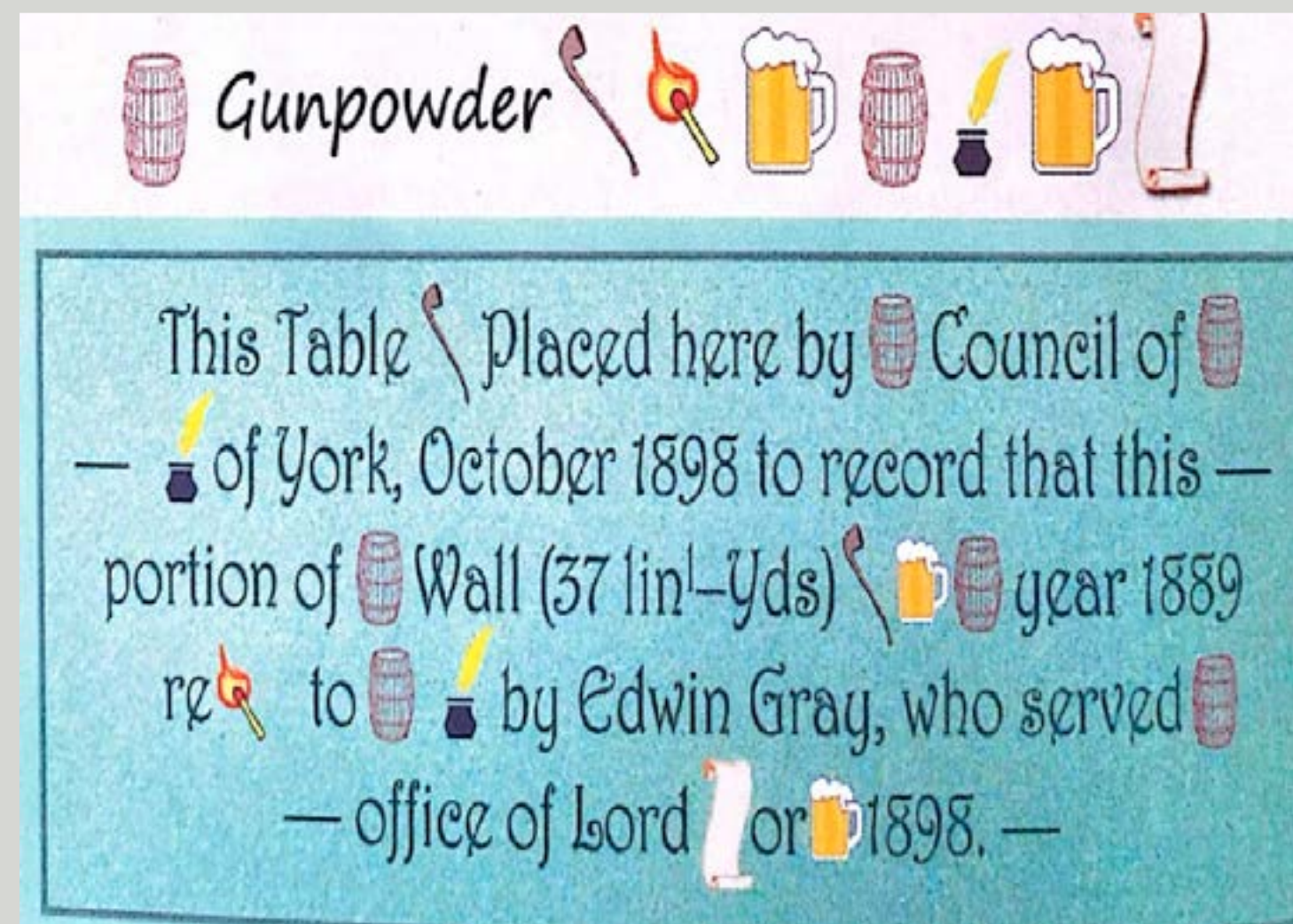
On this street you need to walk down, sticking to the left hand side, until you reach an inlet on the left, in front of the Monkbar Pharmacy. In that inlet turn right into Monk Bar and up the stairs onto the Wall. Follow the wall down to the left, the clue is after the stairs.

Walk along the city walls, and find an old green plaque. Use missing words, to find a season, and remove it from the pack.



WHEN? WHAT?

Someone who lived within the city in the 1500s was Mother Shipton also known as 'The Witch of York'.

Legends say that she saw into the future and she foresaw The Great Fire of London, The French revolution, The Rise of the Internet and Cardinal Wolsey's fall from power as discussed in Stop 1!

Eliminate the season connected to the month in the answer sheet attached using the clues from the task above

If the wall is busy then walk in single file and when you reach the next stop show the group the picture.

If you can't access the wall then go around it using Lord Mayor's Walk



Directions:

Carry on walking down the Wall and follow it as it turns left.

You will then reach a pedestrian overpass and then walk down the stairs.

Then turn left onto St Leonard's Pl and then turn right into Exhibition Square. The clue is in the Square.

If the Wall is crowded walk around it on Lord Mayor's Walk, turn right into Gillygate and then follow the wall down the road to Exhibition Square.

WHEN? WHAT?

In 1541 York hosted a royal reception when henry VIII visited the city on a northern tour of his kingdom.

He was accompanied by Catherine Howard his fifth wife of a grand total of 6.

Catherine Howard was later executed in the Tower of London just as a previous wife, Anne Boleyn (Catherine's cousin), had also suffered the same fate.

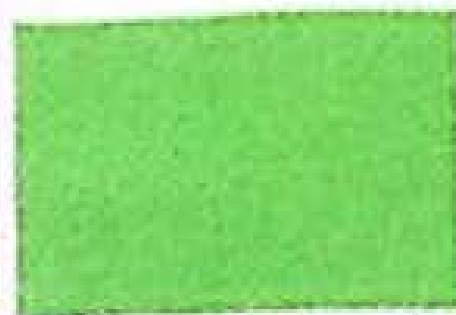
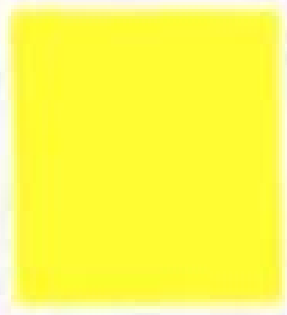

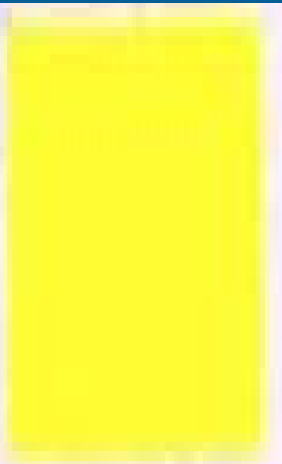
Directions:

From the Exhibition Square go back onto St Leonard's Pl and turn left down that road.

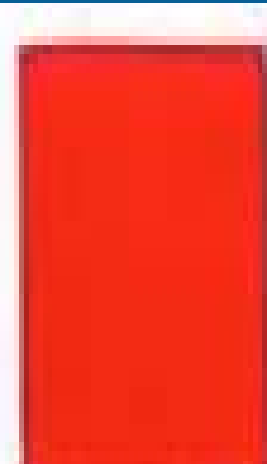
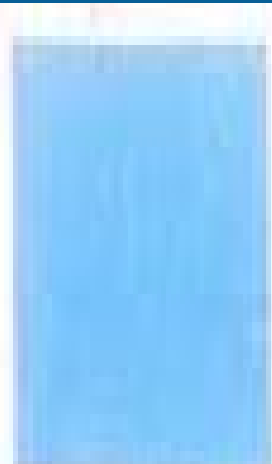
When you reach the cross-roads use the traffic lights to cross to the left and walk down Duncombe Pl. The Garden is on the right in the middle of that road.

One of the most famous bandits of York is Dick Turpin. He had to flee York after he shot a man. He took up the identity of John Palmer but was arrested after stealing Horses.

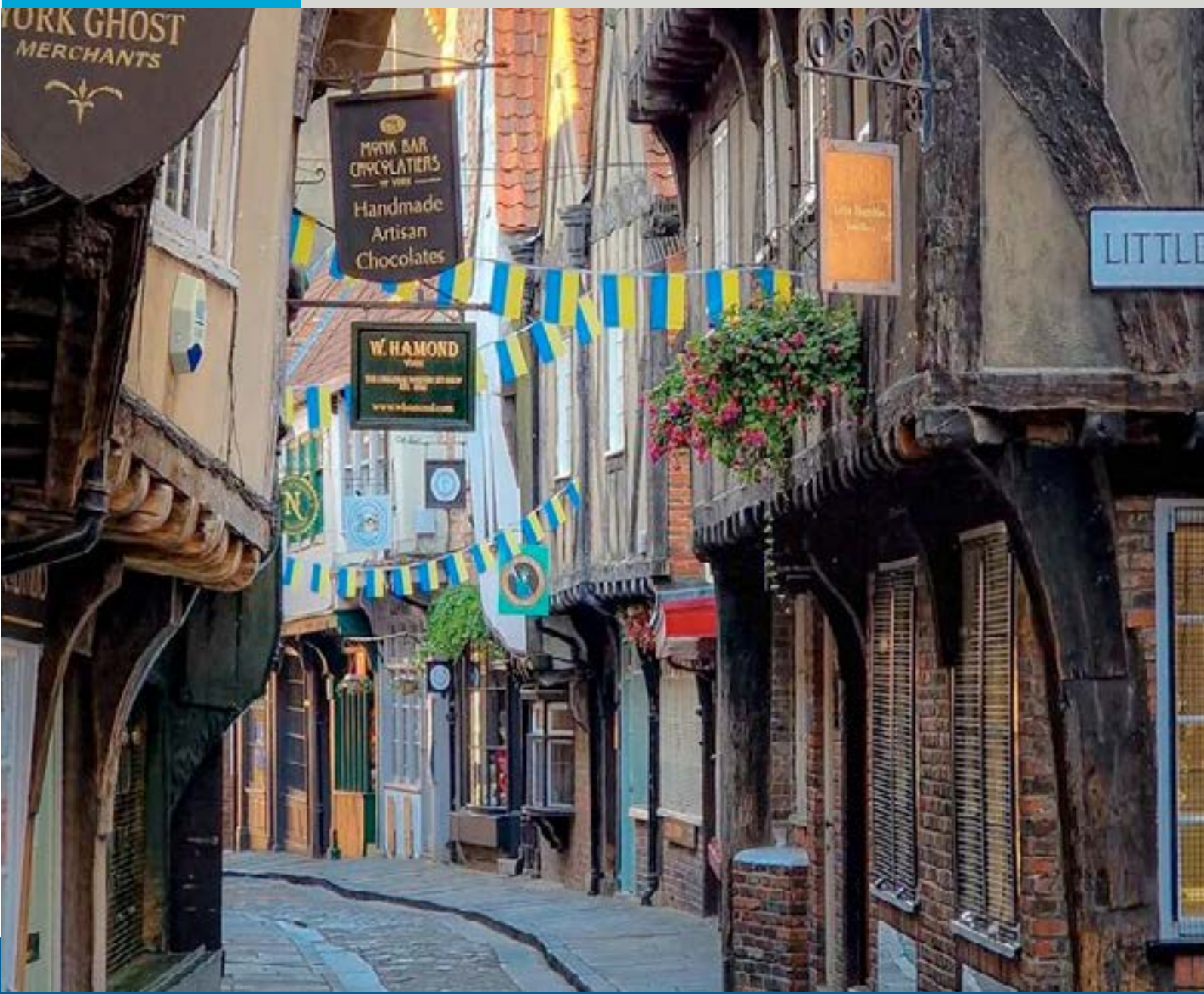
However his true identity was only discovered after he wrote a letter to his brother and the local post office recognised his handwriting!

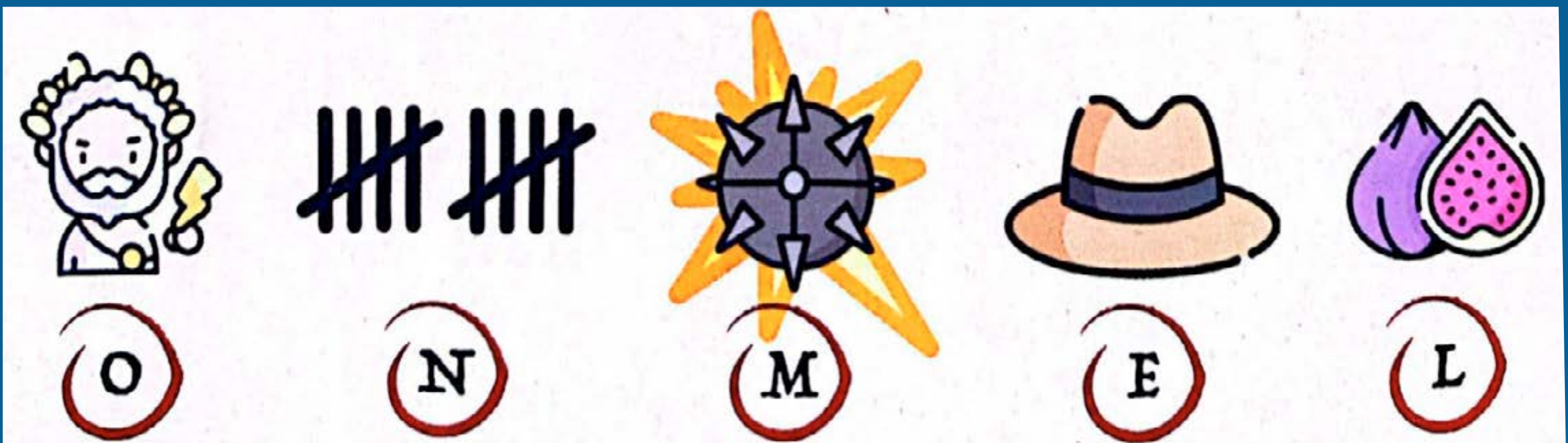
Eliminate some evidence from the main image on the answer sheet attached by using the message of the sentence to link to something in the image.

WHEN? WHAT?

Directions:

The Goddess is in Low Petergate St. From Davygate walk down and turn left onto Church St. Carry on the left side of Church St and then turn left after the third road, this is lower Petergate St.

During the 16th century this street was a centre of bookshops and printers.

Outside of number 33 there is a red devil. This devil was often blamed for the errors which were common in the early days of printing books.

E.G. in 1631 one thousand bibles were published with key words missing!

From Low Petergate, please turn left back onto Grape Lane and where the Lane turns left, take the right inlet and Barley Hall will be in the middle. The clue is in the courtyard of Barley Hall.

WHEN? WHAT?

Here there is a statue of Emperor Constantine who was crowned here in AD 306.

He is famous for spreading Christianity throughout the empire.

When he returned to Rome he stopped a rebellion led by his brother-in-law and it was this decisive victory that enabled the spread of Christianity as the main religion in Europe, changing the history of the continent.

Directions:

With the Hall behind you turn right and continue down Coffee Yard. When you reach Stonegate St turn right again and cross over Low Petergate onto Minster Gate which then becomes Minster Yard, turn right there and the clue is somewhere ahead near Deangate.
