Managing timings...?



- 1. The most haunted island on earth! Despite its small size the Isle of Wight has had more sightings/hauntings than anywhere else on the planet!
- 2. The sunniest place in the UK. If you are looking for the places that get the most sun in the year then that is the Isle of Wight! It gets 1800 to 2000 hours of sun which actually works out more than some of Spain.
- 3. It is rich in dinosaur history and there is evidence that over 20 dinosaur breeds once hung out on the island.
- 4. Sir Christopher Cockerell invented the Hovercraft in the 1950s on the island.
- 5. More people holiday there than live there. About 140,000 people live on the island and about 2 million people visit for their holidays.
- 6. It is where the first radio was set up. Guglielmo Marconi in 1896 set up the first wireless radio on the Isle of Wight.
- 7. Look for thriving red squirrels. For a long time now in Britain, the grey squirrels have been wiping out the native red squirrels until it has become rare to see them.

#### **Instructions:**

#### 1. Detailed Exploration:
