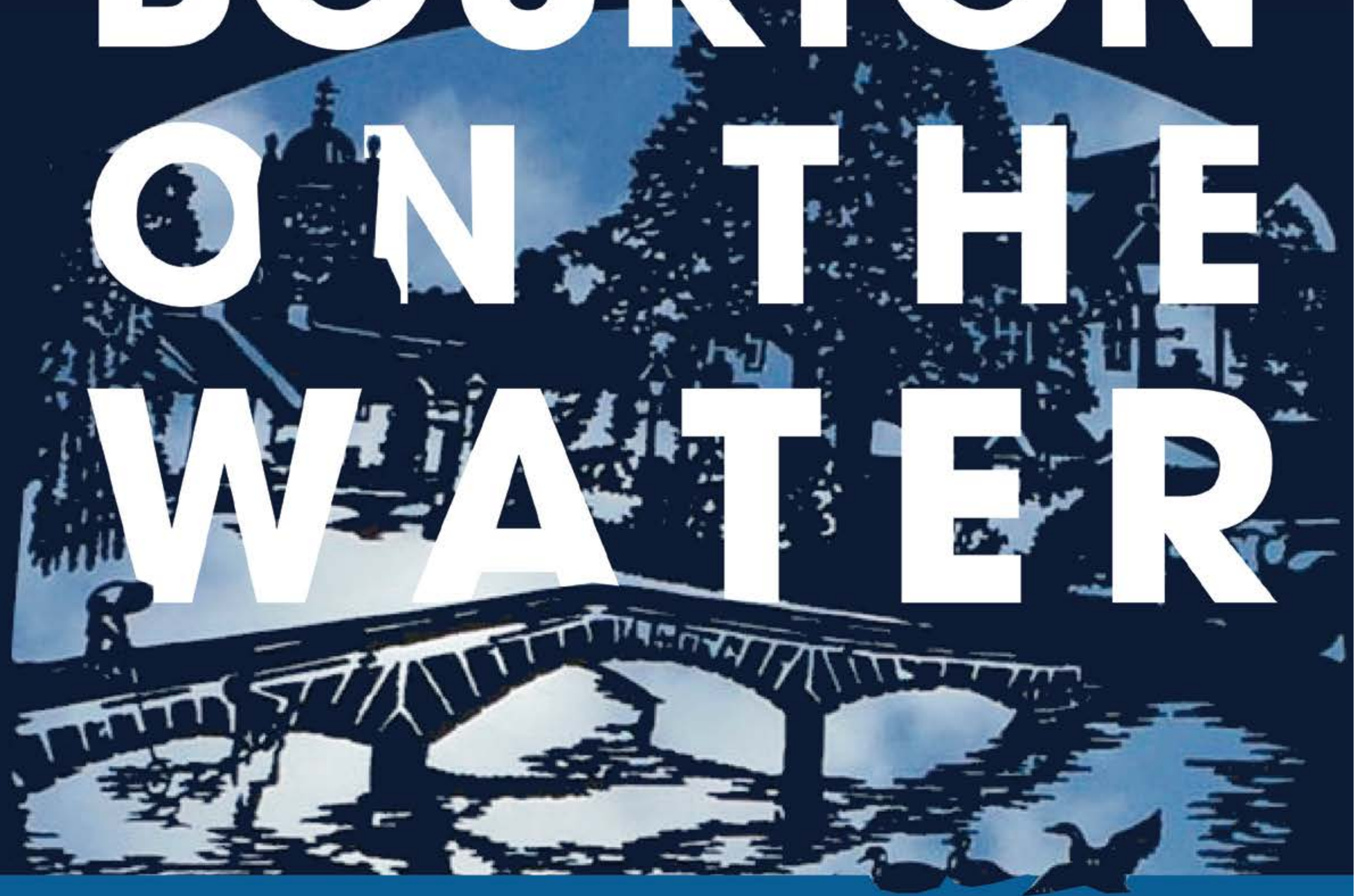

1. The 5 stone bridges, that go across the river windrush, earned this village the nickname of “Venice of the Cotswolds”.

2. Around 300,000 visitors come here per year, which is a lot more than the 3,500 residents.

3. Ancient Roman Pottery and coins discovered in the village itself give clear evidence of extended Roman occupation.

4. During the construction of the school’s maths block, it was discovered to be on top of a Roman cemetery.

5. Parts of the James Bond movie Die Another Day (2002) were filmed in the car park at Bourton-on-the-Water and on the nearby ex-RAF aircraft runway at RAF Little Rissington.

6. During the summer, a game of medieval football is played with goalposts set up in the River Windrush itself. Two teams play with a standard football and a referee attempts to keep order. Crowds line the banks of the river and the aim is to score as many goals as possible (while getting everyone else as wet as possible).

7. The word bourton is of saxon origin and is made up of two words- ‘burgh’ which means camp or fortification, and ‘ton’ which means village or settlement.



Instructions:

1. Detailed Exploration:

Begin your sketching session by embarking on an exploration of the designated area, focusing on interesting spots along the riverside.

Pay close attention to details such as the architecture, flora, fauna, and overall atmosphere of the location.

Take time to observe and immerse yourself in the surroundings, noting unique features that catch your eye.

Capture the essence of the location through your sketches, aiming to convey its distinctive character and ambiance.

2. Landmarks:

Choose a prominent landmark from the provided options, either one of the five iconic bridges spanning the river or the river itself, as the focal point for your sketch.

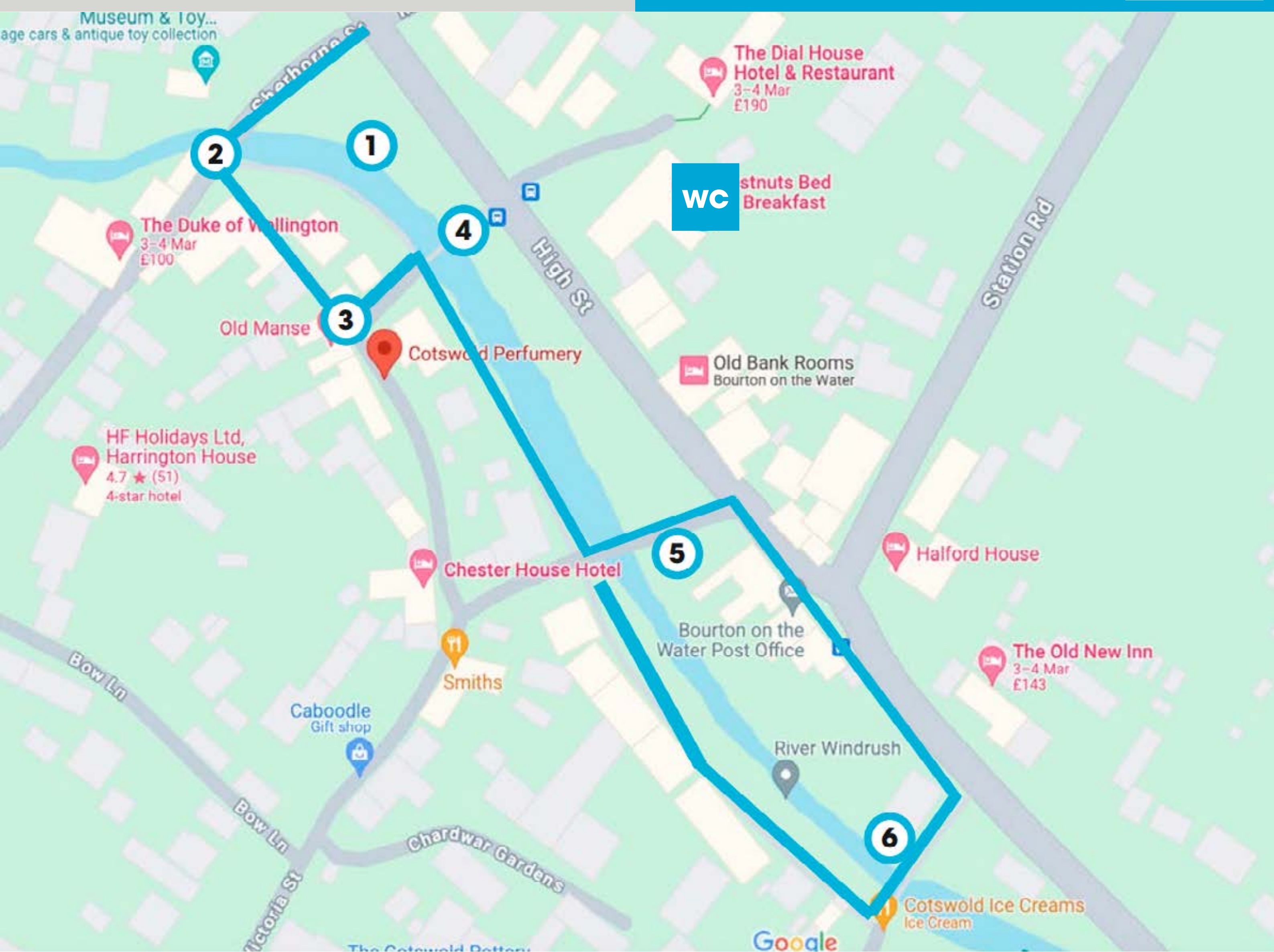
Use your artistic skills to depict the chosen landmark in a visually appealing manner, paying attention to its architectural or natural features.

Consider incorporating creative elements into your sketch, such as depicting motion or creating a themed drawing related to the landmark or the surrounding area.

Ensure that your sketch includes the natural green spaces surrounding the landmark, integrating them seamlessly into the composition.

Bonus points will be awarded to teams that demonstrate creativity in their sketches, such as incorporating elements of motion or thematic elements.

Additionally, including the natural green spaces in the drawings will be rewarded with bonus points, enhancing the overall depiction of the riverside landscape.

On the Hight Street cross the second bridge and then turn left onto the main parallel road.

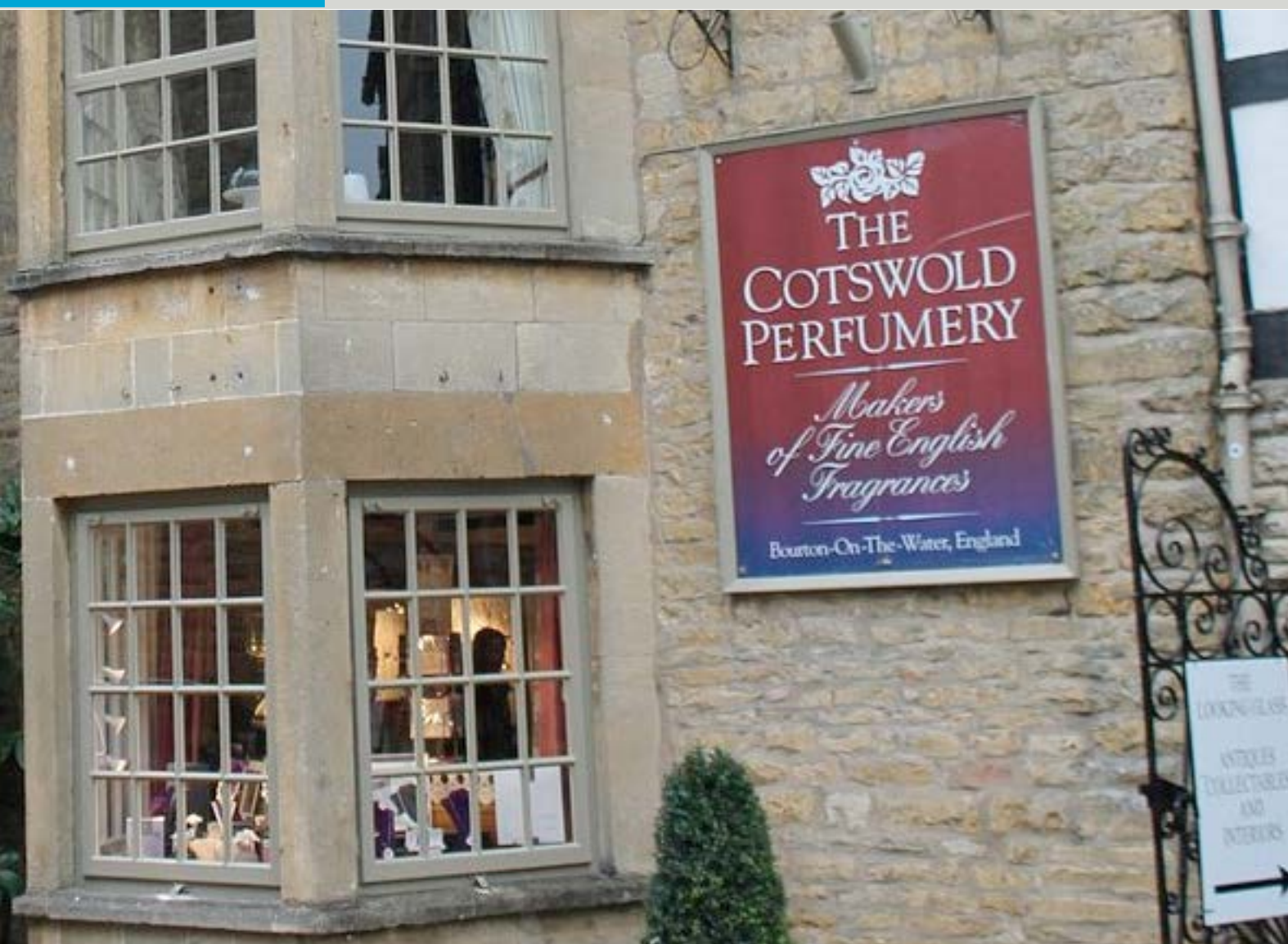
